'Baldhead' placed on \$5,000 Bond for Breaching Protection Order

A 53-year-old labourer was placed on bond in the sum of \$5,000 to keep the peace and be of good behaviour for one year. The man was sentenced yesterday by Magistrate Sarah De Silva at the Sangre Grande Magistrates' Court after being charged on Thursday 19th August, 2021 with two counts of Assault by threats and three counts of Breach of a Protection Order.

CURTIS CHARLES, also known as **'Baldhead'**, **'Jasper'** and **'Shortman'**, of Hicks Lane, Eastern Main Road, D'abadie, previously appeared in court on Friday 20th August, where he pleaded guilty to the three counts of breach of a protection order. He pleaded not guilty to the assault by threat charge and was granted bail the sum \$45,000 and was ordered to stay 100 feet away from the complainant and to have no communication with her.

A Protection Order was issued on 5th March 2021, after Charles made telephone calls to his former common law wife on Sunday 28th February, 2021 and again on Wednesday 3rd March, 2021, where he threatened to kill her if she didn't come back home. However, Charles breached the Protection Order when he again called the woman on 20th March, 2021 and the 16th August, 2021, wanting to know her whereabouts.

On Wednesday 18th August 2021 at 4pm, the woman was in the bedroom at a house in Biche when she heard Charles calling her name asking to talk. She then heard knocking on a glass window in the living room. The woman looked outside and saw Charles. He was arrested in Biche on 18th August at 5:30 pm and was charged on 19th August, 2021 at the Sangre Grande Police Station.
