‘Bullet Milk’ Jailed 36 Months’ Hard Labour for Robbing Man, Ammo Possession

A 27-year old man, who pleaded guilty to Larceny and Possession of Ammunition last Wednesday, was sentenced to 36 months’ hard labour by a Sangre Grande Magistrate.

BRIAN WILSON, also known as ‘Bullet Milk,’ of North-Eastern Settlement, Sangre Grande, was arrested on April 15th and later charged with Larceny of a cell phone and Possession of Ammunition on April 18th by PC Wong, of the Sangre Grande Criminal Investigations Department (CID), who led investigations into a report of Larceny of a cell phone along the Eastern Main Road (EMR), Sangre Grande, in the vicinity of the bus terminal.

WILSON was sentenced to 12 months’ hard labour on the charge of Larceny of a Cell Phone and 24 months’ hard labour for the charge of Possession of Three Rounds of nine 5.56 Ammunition and three rounds of 12 gauge cartridges. The sentences are to run concurrently.

According to police reports, at 10 am on April 14th, a student was walking along the EMR when he was approached by a man known to him.

The suspect requested a phone call and the student handed over his Apple iPhone XS. While awaiting return of the phone to him, the student then saw the man running away from him.

A report was subsequently made at the Sangre Grande Police Station and an investigation was launched.

Police later arrested the suspect and executed a search warrant at his North-Eastern Settlement, Sangre Grande home where they found a black plastic bag which contained nine rounds of 5.56 ammunition and three rounds of 12-gauge cartridges. They also recovered the stolen Apple iPhone XS.

The matter was heard by Senior Magistrate Cheron Raphael.
